Dear Parent/Carer(s),

As we end the school year I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued and unrelenting support. This last school year has been an exceptionally challenging one for everybody associated with the school community, but we have all worked tirelessly together to ensure that we could continue to provide the highest level of educational as well as personal support for all of our pupils.

#### **Updates**

The first official day of the new academic year will be Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September and this will be an INSET day. Years 7 and 11 will attend school on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September and Years 8, 9 and 10 will be set work to complete remotely. Registration will be online and pupils will then attend school on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September.

The first 2 weeks of term will see our 'Year Ahead' meetings returning and this will give you as Parents / Carers the chance to come into school, meet the Senior and Pastoral team and find out what the year might have in store for your children.

There has been a slight adjustment to our uniform – the girls PE kit now allows girls to wear plain black leggings. We will continue allowing pupils to wear their PE kit on days when they have PE on their timetable.

We have recently sought your views on progress evenings and the use of mobile phones in school. These views have been important for us in reaching decisions about next year.

We have decided to run a hybrid approach to progress evenings for next year with Year 7 and 8 being face to face and Years 9, 10 and 11 being virtual.

We have made the decision to ban the use of mobile phones within school between the hours of 8.30-2.45. Pupils will be allowed to bring them into school but will be expected to have them off and out of sight between these hours.

More detailed information on all of these things will be sent home toward the end of August in preparation for the pupils returning.
